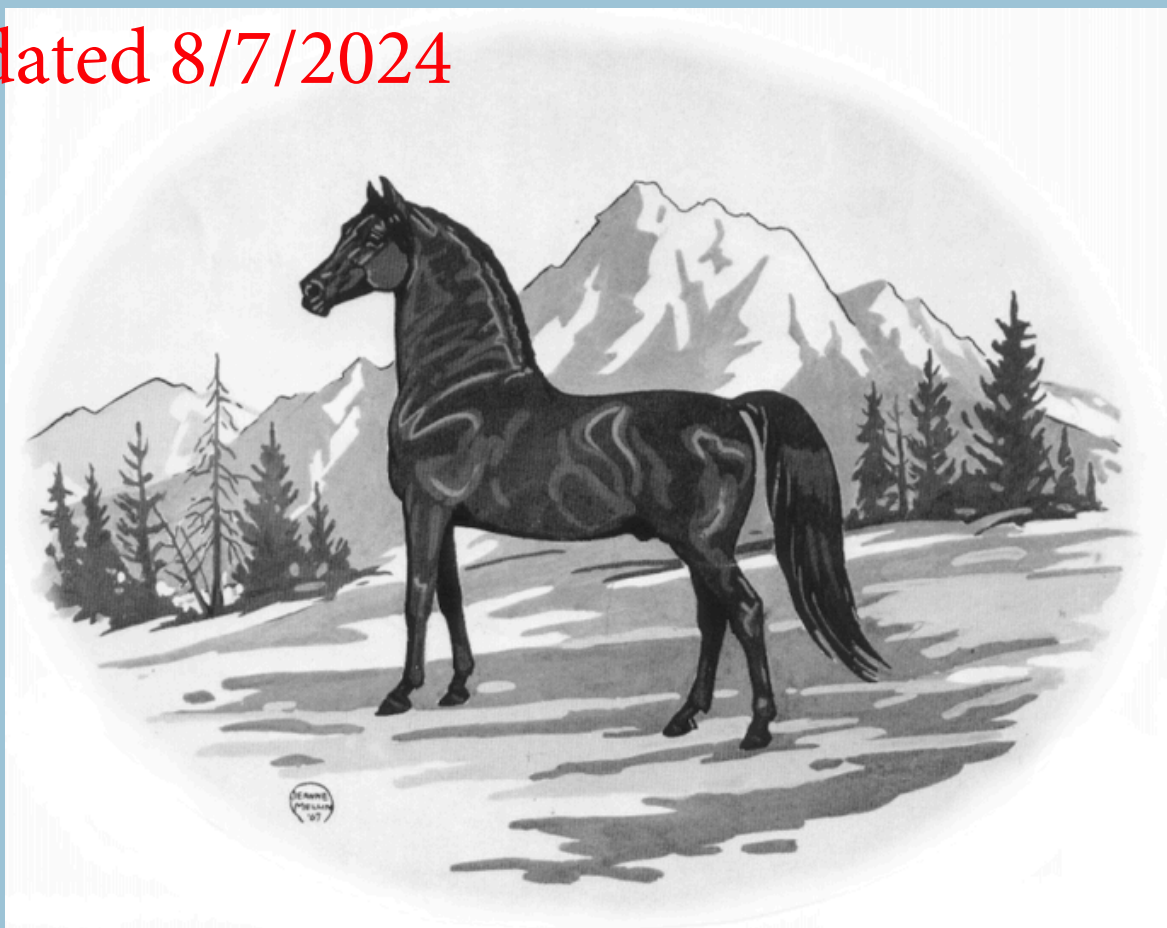

ENTRIES – PLEASE READ THE FOLLOWING REQUIREMENTS CAREFULLY

Entries • See the table “**DATES, DEADLINES, CANCELLATIONS & CHANGES**”. If the entry is **NOT RECEIVED BY** this date, it will be considered a late entry and post entry fees will be added to your entry. **By signing and submitting an entry to this show, it is your intent to show and agree to our rules. You agree to pay all fees due and understand that refunds will not be made except by policy stated.**

EMAIL ENTRIES

The preferred method for entering this show is to email entries to the show secretary.

- This show will accept bank checks by mail.
- Mail Entry Agreement (back of entry form) with signatures to show secretary. Include checks for payment.

Entry Cancellations, Refunds & Substitutions • To encourage early entries,

1. If an exhibitor vets out a horse between the close of entries and **before 7pm August 21, 2024**, and brings a replacement horse, the post entry for such class will be waived.
2. Absolutely no requests for refunds for any reason will be considered unless request with supporting documentation is in the show secretary's hand prior to 7PM, **August 21, 2024**, for consideration. Such refund will include all fees less a \$50 cancellation fee.
3. After 7PM **August 21, 2024**, no refunds will be made except in the case of unusual situations. The Show Management reserves the right to review these situations case by case upon receipt of written request with supporting documentation.

Entry Confirmation • Will be sent via e-mail to the legible email address on your entry. Please check acknowledgement for accuracy and requests for additional information and/or monies to avoid incomplete entry charges and delays in the show office when you arrive at the show.

Entry Payment • Make checks **payable in US Funds to PNW Morgan Horse Show**. Show Management cannot accept an entry unless it is accompanied by a valid check, cash, or money order for the full amount of the entry costs, including entry fees, drug fee, and AHA and USEF non-member fees. Full balance owed on entries is due at time of processing of entries. Entries received without a valid check, or money order will not be processed until payment is received and will be subject to post entry penalties if payment is postmarked after close of entries.

OPEN CHECKS - At check-in, before show numbers will be released, all exhibitors will be required to leave an open check separate from their entries to cover any additional entries, fines or penalties incurred at the show. International exhibitors must draw all checks on U.S. Funds.

Refusal of Entries: • Management reserves the right to remove any horse or person from the show who has shown an objectionable attitude or behavior towards its management, or previous unsportsmanlike behavior, without being liable for compensation or **damages**.

Returned Checks • Dishonored checks will incur a **\$50** charge per domestic failure (\$75 per International check). Payments will not be processed through the bank a second time. To retain entries, fees plus penalty must be paid by US money order, cashier's check, or cash. In the event a check is returned or credit card denied by the bank after the completion of the show, it will be handled in accordance with USEF GR913.

Stall Stripping • **NEW** - a **\$35** per horse stall fee will be due as cash or check to the office at check-in. This fee is charged by the Tacoma Unit to cover the stripping of stalls. The fee will be held until the end of show. This stripping fee will be returned if stalls are stripped prior to departure at the end of the show. If horse stalls are not stripped, the \$35/horse stall fee will go to the Unit. **PNW does not receive any portion of these fees, these fees are charged by the Tacoma Unit.**

DRESSAGE AND WESTERN DRESSAGE ENTRIES

Entries open August 1, 2024 for Dressage/Western Dressage. **PLEASE NOTE:** At this time, ride times will be limited to two tests per rider per Western Dressage and per Classical Dressage. Please email your entry early, but not before August 1st. The close of entries is **August 8, 2024 at midnight**. A wait list will be established and should ride times remain available, tests will be offered in the order an entry was received.

Ride times will be posted on our Facebook page PNW Morgan Horse Show approximately 5 days prior to the show.

FACILITY INFORMATION

Upon arrival, stall assignments will be posted at the show office.

Arenas & Footing • All arenas have dirt or sand footing. Management reserves the right to move classes to other arenas if weather or class schedules necessitate. Please note that the outdoor rodeo arena, and round pens are OFF LIMITS to PNW exhibitors. The Tacoma Unit asks that there is no lunging in the main arena or covered warm up arena. For dressage rides, ring size will be 20 x 56.7 meters.

Dogs (& Other pets) • Pets will NOT be allowed in the concessions area at any time. Pets are not allowed in the main arena. Pets are not permitted to be loose on competition grounds and must be on a leash or otherwise contained. Individuals must not lead pets on a leash while mounted. Pet owners are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses, or actions resulting from their pet behaviors. Pet owners are required to clean up after their pets in all areas including barns and RV parking. Pet owners failing to comply with this rule may be subject to penalty as well as issuance of warning cards (GR1301.6)

Bedding • Shavings are now provided in bulk at \$35/horse stall, including day stalls. Stalls will NOT have bedding in them when you arrive. Straw bedding is prohibited. Used bedding must be deposited in the manure dumps supplied. A separate stall stripping \$35 per horse stall fee will be due as cash or check to the office at check-in. The fee will be held until the end of show. This stripping fee will be returned if stalls are stripped prior to departure at the end of the show. If horse stalls are not stripped, the \$35/horse stall fee will go to the Tacoma Unit. PNW does not receive these fees, these fees are charged by the Tacoma Unit.

Food • Concessions are not available at the Tacoma Unit at this time.

Haul-in/Trailer fee • You may show out of your trailer at this show at a cost of \$30 per day. Please park in designated "haul-in" area.

Motorized Vehicles • Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state

in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. (updated 3/2023)

Non-Competing Horses on the show grounds • Horses not entered in the show are allowed on the show grounds for a \$50 fee. These horses must have an individually assigned stall (not shared) and a signed liability release form in the horse show office.

Parking • All vehicles must be kept in designated parking areas. Trailers may be pulled to the barns to load and unload. All aisles and roadways around barns must be kept open due to fire regulations. Owners will be asked to move vehicles or risk towing and/or fines. No vehicles allowed to be parked in the barns at any time.

RV/Camper Hook Ups: • RV- hookups are available at \$37.00 a night. Any vehicles or trailers blocking an RV hookup will incur the \$37/night fee. The Tacoma Unit will be charging for dry camping as well. The rate for dry/non-RV camping will be \$12/night. All vehicles parked around the RV hookups on the designated power poles will incur an RV hookup fee as assessed by the Tacoma Unit WHETHER THEY ARE USING THE POWER OR NOT. To avoid this fee – PLEASE do not park near the RV hookups unless you intend to use the power and are paying the RV fee.

Sharps Containers for Medical Waste • (needles, syringes, etc.) will be available, one in the barn aisles for every 50 stalls (GR1210.4) A \$100 fine per violation will be passed on to the violator for improper disposal of needles or other medical waste.

FACILITY INFORMATION

Stabling • Permanent box stalls with full or half doors are available at a rate of \$155.00 per stall. Tack stalls are available at the same rate. Dressage stalls will be available for one night only at a rate of \$60.00 per stall. Exhibitors will be billed for the cost of repairing any damage.

Anyone showing from their trailer must pay a \$30.00 haul-in per horse per day. Those requiring stabling for a longer period of time must make arrangements with the show secretary. Stabling fees will be refunded only if stall is resold. DO NOT dump water buckets in stalls. Stalls where water buckets have been dumped out will have a \$50/stall fee assessed by the Tacoma Unit. DO NOT leave nails/other metal hanging objects in stalls. Stalls left with nails will have a \$25/stall fee assessed by the Tacoma Unit.

Early arrivals/Late departures • Arrivals prior to 12pm on Wednesday, August 21st will incur a \$30/stall horse hotel charge, charged by the facility, NO EXCEPTIONS. All early arrivals must be confirmed with show management. Similarly, those staying at the facility beyond August 25th will incur a \$30/stall horse hotel charge, charged by the facility, NO EXCEPTIONS. All late departures must be confirmed with show management.

Curtains and Decorations • All lumber, nails, building materials, etc. must be removed. Failure to dispose of material will result in a minimum of \$100 fine or actual cost of clean-up to the persons renting stalls.

Travel Requirements • You are responsible for complying with Washington's transport requirements.

Vaccination Policy • REMINDER PER USEF RULE GR844 ALL HORSES ENTERING THE GROUNDS MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY DOCUMENTATION OF EQUINE INFLUENZA VIRUS AND EQUINE HERPES VIRUS RHINOPNEUMONITIS VACCINATIONS WITHIN SIX MONTHS PRIOR TO STABLING.

Please maintain high standards of hygiene in all areas where horses reside or interact with handlers. limit access for Human-to-Horse and Horse-to-Horse contact as much as possible. Info on disease outbreak and biosecurity is available at <https://equinediseasecc.org/>. No refunds will be given if right to compete is denied because the Vaccination Record is missing or incomplete. Download the form from <https://www.usef.org/documents/membership/EquineVaccinationRecord.pdf> and bring the appropriate, completed, and signed document(s) with you to the competition.

Wash Racks • All horses will be washed in the designated wash areas only. No washing or hosing off of horses may be done in the stalls or alleyways.

MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS

USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT



Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above, Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage Competitions, Endurance Rides and Vaulting Competitions: (See GR828.4 of the Federation rules). Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent, at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined

Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR231) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes. (01/15/2023)

Amateur Certification • Only active Federation members may obtain amateur certification. Every person who has reached his/her 18th birthday and competes in classes for amateurs under Federation rules must possess current amateur certification issued by the Federation. Only active Federation members may obtain amateur certification, Amateur cards are no longer available for non-members. Any person who has not reached his/her 19th birthday is an amateur and does not require amateur certification. An amateur continues to be such until he/she has received a change in status from the Federation. There is no fee for amateur certification for Senior Active or Life Members. Refer to GR1306 & GR1307. **Any Active Equine Canada member who is not a current USEF member** and wants to compete in an amateur class may sign for Federation Amateur status on a show by show basis at no cost. (12/1/22). They are not required to pay for a USEF membership or a Show Pass fee. Once the application has been processed, their amateur status will then show up on the USEF website – usef.org and under Search, Membership as “Non-Member Amateur – INACTIVE”.

USEF Non-Member Participation • <https://www.usef.org/faqs/usef-show-pass> **The rules have changed for 2023.** if the competition cannot verify membership information, the exhibitor will be required to complete a Show Pass form online with usef.org and pay a non-refundable fee. **Eligible exhibitors are prohibited from obtaining more than one (1) Show Pass per competition year.** Purchase of a Show Pass fee does NOT allow a competitor to show in amateur classes. Walk/trot only riders are exempt. (12/22)

REMINDER: US EQUESTRIAN SAFE SPORT –All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. AHA MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT

EACH COMPETITOR (THIS INCLUDES AT LEAST ONE RECORDED OWNER AND ALL TRAINERS, DRIVERS, RIDERS, HALTER HANDLERS, COACHES AND THE PERSON(S) SIGNING THE ENTRY BLANK) IN AN ARABIAN HORSE ASSOCIATION RECOGNIZED ARABIAN DIVISION, AT THE TIME OF ENTRY INTO A COMPETITION, MUST SUBMIT A COPY OF A VALID AHA MEMBERSHIP/COMPETITION CARD, JOIN AHA OR PAY AN AHA SINGLE EVENT MEMBERSHIP FEE PER COMPETITOR. WHEN AN AGENT SIGNS FOR THE OWNER AT AN AHA RECOGNIZED COMPETITION, BOTH THE OWNER AND AGENT MUST BE MEMBERS OF AHA OR PAY THE AHA SINGLE EVENT MEMBERSHIP. SINGLE EVENT MEMBERSHIP IS NOT ACCEPTABLE AT AHA REGIONAL OR NATIONAL COMPETITIONS. EXHIBITORS IN WALK-TROT CLASSES ARE EXEMPT FROM AHA MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS AT QUALIFYING COMPETITIONS BUT MUST HAVE AN AHA MEMBERSHIP WITH COMPETITION CARD AT AHA REGIONAL AND NATIONAL COMPETITIONS. EXHIBITORS IN LEAD LINE CLASSES OR PARENTS/GUARDIANS SIGNING FOR MINORS ARE EXEMPT FROM AHA MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS. (BOD 5/12)



AHA Competition Card Requirements • All riders, drivers, owners, agents and handlers who exhibit horses in the show ring or sign the entry form as the responsible party for any individual's horses at the show must be AHA COMPETITION level members with competition cards. **If the recorded owner is an entity (Farm, Ranch, Syndicate, etc.) it must have a current AHA Business membership.** AHA does not permit Single Event Memberships at AHA Regional Championship Shows. An AHA COMPETITION membership is required for all, including walk/trot riders. Lead Line or Parent/Guardian signing for minors are exempt.

RULES & GENERAL INFORMATION

EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT USEF RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH. MANAGEMENT RESERVES THE RIGHT TO REFUSE ANY ENTRY IN ACCORDANCE WITH GR914. EACH PARTICIPANT IN THIS SHOW IS RESPONSIBLE FOR KNOWLEDGE OF AND IS SUBJECT TO THE USEF RULES. THE USEF RULE BOOK IS AVAILABLE AT WWW.USEF.ORG

Changes, Cancellation or Division of classes • Management reserves the right to make changes of arenas, judges or class order to facilitate time schedule and conditions for betterment of the Show. The Show Committee reserves the right to cancel, combine, or divide any classes or make any scheduling changes necessary. All changes will be posted on the Announcement Board at the office.

Discipline • Exhibitors are advised that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to staff or officials of this show on part of the owner, exhibitor, agent, lessee, trainer, groom, rider, driver, handler, or family of the person participating in the show, will disqualify the horse from adjudication. Management reserves the right to remove a horse or any person from the show without being liable for compensation or damages.

Disputes not covered by the rules • Should any question or dispute arise not provided for in the governing rules of USEF and AHA and AMHA, the same shall be referred to Show Management, whose decision shall be final.

Drug and medication rule • Refer to USEF Chapter 4, The official Medication Report Form is now on line at: <https://competitions.usef.org/drugs-and-meds/medication-report-form/usef>.

Judges • Show Management reserves the right to substitute a judge for one who is officially designated.

Show Office Hours • The horse show office will be open from one hour before the first class until one-half hour after the last class of the day. Trainers may schedule appointments.

Admission to the Arena and Paddock Area • No person will be allowed in the ring except participants in the class, licensed officials, assistants, and show photographer. Properly attired attendants will be allowed in the ring only after being called by the judge, ringmaster, or announcer. There shall be no conduct in the paddock area which disturbs or creates a hazard to horses, handlers, or spectators.

Attention Competitors • Each competitor is responsible for supplying management with correct association numbers (USEF, Equine Canada, AHA) for horse, owner, rider/driver/handler, trainer and coach before the day(s) of the competition. The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be counted toward national awards and breed association programs.

Awards of Trophies and Ribbons • Trophy and ribbons to six places in all classes except Junior Exhibitor classes, which will be awarded eight ribbons. Morgan In-Hand Show Champions will receive appropriate perpetual trophies and ribbon. Reserve Show In-Hand Champions will receive appropriate ribbon. In performance classes in which Morgan perpetual trophies are awarded, winners will receive an accompanying "keeper" prize and appropriate ribbon.

Morgan Perpetual Trophies will be made available for pick up in the show office following the class's session. Trophies will be present in the ring for award pictures, but Recipients of perpetual trophies MUST sign trophy agreement prior to picking up trophy. Trophies awarded the previous year MUST be dropped off at the show office prior to the start of the show.

Call for classes • Due to unforeseeable problems with any mechanical device, the public address system must be considered a courtesy. It is the exhibitors' responsibility to follow how quickly classes are progressing and to promptly present themselves when the gate person calls for their class.

Morgan High Point Horse Award • High point awards will be awarded to five horses earning the most competition points for the entire weekend; one each in the Hunter, Western, English, Driving, and Dressage divisions. The Catherine Cloud perpetual trophy will be awarded to the rider earning the highest score in traditional dressage (excluding introductory level). All classes in appropriate attire to count.

Morgan Versatility Award •

Rules for competition:

1. Exhibitor must register the horse for the award on the entry blank.
2. The horse must enter at least five different categories
3. The horse may enter as many classes as desired, but only the highest placing in each category will count toward the award.
4. Points will be tabulated as follows: 1st – one point for each horse shown, 2nd – one point less, 3rd – one less, etc. Example: For a class with five entries: 1st = 5 points, 2nd = 4 points, 3rd = 3 points, etc.
5. A tie will be resolved in favor of the horse with the most first place awards, second place awards, etc.

Categories in which horses may earn points are as follows: Combination (ride/drive and Hunter/Western), Hunter Pleasure, English Pleasure, In-Hand, Sport Horse In-Hand, Musical Freestyle, Pleasure Driving, Road Hack, Bridle Path Hack, Sidesaddle, Trail Horse,

RULES & GENERAL INFORMATION

Western Pleasure, Classic Saddle, Classic Driving, Carriage Driving, Hunter Hack, Disciplined Rail, Dressage, Western Dressage and Dressage Suitability, Reining, and Ranch Riding. Masters and Walk-Trot Pleasure may be used to meet English, Driving, Hunter or Western Pleasure requirement. Equitation including Walk-trot, Equitation & Showmanship earns one point for participation if the rider places. Horses competing for the Versatility Award must be entered in the appropriate space on the front of the entry blank or nominated at the show prior to their first class to count for points.

Morgan Jr Exhibitor High Point Award • Four High-Point Junior Exhibitor Awards will be presented, one each for Hunt Seat, Western, Saddle Seat (Saddle Seat to include Classic.) and Walk-Trot. Jr. Exhibitors may show in all classes and all seats that they wish, but they may sign up for a High Point Award in only one seat or walk-trot, and must sign up and declare which classes they are entering for points before the first class of the show.

Arabian High Point Award • Please talk with show management if you are interested in sponsoring an Arabian high point award. Show Management will address high point awards in future years based on breed participation and interest.

Amateur Owner Classes • Horses entered in amateur owner and junior owner classes must be registered in the name of the competitor or a member of the competitor's family, as defined by USEF Rules. Horses registered in a farm/ranch/syndicate/ partnership/corporation name may be shown in Amateur Owner classes provided the family is the sole owner of the farm or entity. The sale of a horse does not eliminate this registration requirement. Every competitor must be an amateur and the owner, or an amateur member of the owner's family. Leased horses are not eligible. (Contracts of Sale or Bill of Sale will not be accepted in Owner Classes.)

Amateur Owner "Family" Definition • *For ownership by the same family, the term family includes the following: spouse, parent, stepparent, child, stepchild, brother, sister, half brother and sister, aunt, uncle, niece, nephew, step-brother and sister, grandparents and grandchildren, and in-laws of the same relation as stated above. Family also includes a cohabitant, a member of a couple who live together and have an intimate relationship without being married.*

UNRELATED OWNERS IN OWNER CLASSES – For the purposes of showing in Junior Owner and Amateur Owner classes, two non-related owners will now be able to co-own a horse and show in owner classes provided the following rules are followed. The ownership **MUST** be an AND relationship and not an OR relationship. No family member of a professional may enter into this relationship. "Non-family owners" are defined as two distinct individuals who are not related as family as defined by US Equestrian or Equestrian Canada. The horse must be registered with one of the five Registries in US or Canada or another approved Registry. Family members of these two co-owners are **NOT** permitted to show in owner classes. Both co-owners must be members of USEF or EC and hold valid amateur cards. Co-ownership is limited to two distinct individuals (no farms or business entities). A horse can only be in (1) one non-related Co-ownership per show season – if a co-ownership is terminated, another co-ownership cannot be entered into for that horse until the next year. An individual can only enter into (2) two distinct non-related co-ownerships at any one time. Show management may deny horses in this relationship entry into AO/JO classes with payout in excess of \$2,500. Please see USEF AR110.4.e for complete requirements and limitations.

I have read the rules concerning competitions as printed in the Arabian Horse Association (AHA) Handbook / Directory and Competition Prize List and agree to be bound by and subject to those Rules.

AHA ASSUMPTION OF RISK, RELEASE AND INDEMNIFICATION This document waives very important legal rights. Read it carefully before signing.

In consideration for AHA permitting me to participate in this Competition, and by signing the entry blank, I agree as follows:
I AGREE that I choose to participate voluntarily in this Competition, as a rider, driver, handler, lessee, owner, agent, coach, trainer, junior exhibitor, or as a parent or guardian of a junior exhibitor. **I AM FULLY AWARE AND ACKNOWLEDGE THAT HORSE SPORTS AND PARTICIPATION IN THIS COMPETITION INVOLVE SERIOUS RISK OF HARM INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, RISKS OF ACCIDENT, SERIOUS BODILY INJURY, INCLUDING DEATH, BROKEN BONES, HEAD INJURIES, TRAUMA, PAIN, AND SUFFERING, AND PROPERTY DAMAGE. I ASSUME ALL RISKS OF HARM TO ME, MY HORSE OR MY PROPERTY.**

I AGREE as a Horse Show Participant (or Parent/Guardian of Participant if a minor) to waive all claims which may otherwise arise from, including but not limited to infectious bacteria, viruses, fungi/mold, parasites or other agents which may be present at the Horse Show (and most other outdoor locations) and can cause infection in humans, as well as in animals.

I AGREE for myself, my heirs, executors, administrators, successors and assigns to release AHA, the Competition, the facilities leased by the Competition and the owner(s) of the facilities, and all of their respective officers, officials, directors, employees, agents, personnel, volunteers, affiliated organizations and insurers (collectively, the "Released Parties") from any and all claims for damage, loss, or injury to myself, other persons, horses or other property belonging to me to the fullest extent permitted by law that arises out of or relates in any way to the Competition and my participation in the Competition INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, DAMAGES, LOSS, OR INJURY RESULTING FROM ANY ACTS, FAILURE TO ACT, NEGLIGENCE OR NEGLECT OF OTHER ENTRANTS, THE RELEASED PARTIES, THEIR CONTRACTORS OR INVITEES, as well as for theft, vandalism, fire, other casualty damage, or damage arising out of any defects in the premises.

I AGREE to accept AS FINAL any decision of AHA, the Show Commission or Show Officials concerning my qualification or the qualification of my horse to enter the Competition or any results of the Competition, except to the extent that the Rules of AHA, the Competition, EC or USEF Equestrian permit a protest or hearing of such decisions. Should a hearing be requested, I agree to accept AS FINAL the decision of the particular hearing body. I agree to release, hold harmless and not to sue AHA, the Competition Sponsor, their officers, directors, employees, volunteers or members concerning any decision of AHA, the Competition, its Show Commission, Show Officials or any hearing body that relates to my qualifications or my horse(s)' qualifications to enter the Competition or any results of the Competition.

I AGREE that AHA has the sole right to control, sell, supervise or give away (or assign to others the right to do so) the exclusive rights to broadcast, televise, reproduce, transmit and disseminate all or part of this event, and I agree that AHA may use or assign, in any way AHA sees fit, photographs, films, videos, audios, cablecasts, or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the Competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the Competition or AHA. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way which implies endorsement of any company, product, product category or service. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation.

By signing below as a parent or guardian of a junior exhibitor, I consent to the child's participation and agree to all of the above provisions, and further agree to assume all of the obligations of this AHA Assumption of Risk, Release and Indemnification personally and on behalf of the child.

This AHA Assumption of Risk, Release and Indemnification is governed by the Laws of the State of Colorado and is intended to be interpreted as broadly as possible. I agree that exclusive jurisdiction and venue (place) for any legal action against AHA, its officers, directors, employees, volunteers or agents shall be in the local district courts or the federal court of the State of Colorado. If any part of this agreement is determined to be unenforceable, all other parts shall remain effect.

For and in consideration of United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. dba US Equestrian ("USEF") allowing me, the undersigned, to participate in any capacity (including as a rider, driver, handler, vaulter, longeur, lessee, owner, agent, coach, official, trainer or volunteer) in a USEF sanctioned, licensed or approved event or activity, including but not limited to equestrian clinics, practices, shows, competitions and related or incidental activities and _____ ("USEF Event" or "USEF Events"); I, for myself, and on behalf of my spouse, children, heirs and next of kin, and any legal and personal representatives, executors, administrators, successors,, and assigns, hereby agree to and make the following contractual representations pursuant to this Agreement (the "Agreement"):

A. RULES AND REGULATIONS: I hereby agree that I have read, understand, and agree to be bound by all applicable Federation Bylaws, rules, and policies including the USEF Safe Sport Policy and Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies (MAAPP) as published at www.usef.org, as amended from time to time.

B. ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISK: I knowingly, willingly, and voluntarily acknowledge the inherent risks associated with the sport of equestrian and know that horseback riding and related equestrian activities are inherently dangerous, and that participation in any USEF Event involves risks and dangers including, without limitation, the potential for serious bodily injury (including broken bones, head or neck injuries), sickness and disease (including communicable diseases), trauma, pain & suffering, permanent disability, paralysis and death; loss of or damage to personal property (including my mount & equipment) arising out of the unpredictable behavior of horses; exposure to extreme conditions and circumstances; accidents involving other participants, event staff, volunteers or spectators; contact or collision with other participants and horses, natural or manmade objects; adverse weather conditions; facilities issues and premises conditions; failure of protective equipment (including helmets); inadequate safety measures; participants of varying skill levels; situations beyond the immediate control of the USEF Event organizers and competition management; and other undefined, not readily foreseeable and presently unknown risks and dangers ("Risks").

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot, academy, and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$90), 5-years (\$360), or life (\$1,800). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$72). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards Program and the USDF Regional Schooling Show Awards Program.

Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$240) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$35 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$35). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded but will NOT be counted towards Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$80. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$115) is eligible for Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

How to Join USDF

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

- On the USDF website: www.usdf.org. You can submit the application online or download the form.
- In the show office at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions classified by USEF as Dressage Competitions, and Regular Competitions which are open to all breeds.

The effective date of membership is the date the form and correct fees are received in the USDF office or, if applying at a competition, the date accepted by the competition secretary, provided the application is signed and dated by the competition secretary, member, and/or horse owner on that same day.
